undreds of Greek shipping companies were recognized for their participation in the AMVER program last year, during the 30th anniversary of the Greek AMVER Awards Gala Dinner, which took place on Friday, December 16, 2022, at the Athenaeum Intercontinental Hotel.

Held in the presence of Greek government officials, top US diplomats and senior representatives from across the entire Greek maritime community, the event was organized by the International Propeller Club of the United States, Port of Piraeus, in collaboration with the U.S. Embassy in Greece and the United States Coast Guard.

The AMVER System (Automated Mutual Assistance Vessel Rescue) monitors ships, identifies possible problems and informs ships in the vicinity to approach and provide assistance. It officially came to life on 15 April 1958 through the efforts of the United States Coast Guard and a number of commercial shipping representatives. Over 7,000 lives have been saved by AMVER-participating ships since 2000 and many of them owe their lives to the selfless and altruistic efforts of seamen and vessels of Greek interests. Over 11,000 international ships participate in AMVER and an average of 6,300 ships are added on the AMVER plot each day. The AMVER Center computer receives over 40,000 AMVER messages a day.

On Wednesday, September 8, 2021, the General Assembly and the elections for the new Board of Governors of our Club took place.

This was a hybrid event with an impressive number of participating members, as well as a large online audience, that was held at the Yacht Club of Greece.

Due to the pandemic, the General Assembly was also available for viewing through a live stream for whoever preferred to attend remotely. Additionally, they were given the opportunity to vote online through the Eventora platform.

With a record 309 votes, it was the first time the hybrid voting system was introduced. 185 members voted in person and 124 electronically. At the





A wonderful evening dedicated to the companies, ships and crews that volunteer for the AMVER program, offering valuable search and rescue services at sea. The 2021 Amver Awards ceremony, which was held on Tuesday, December 14, 2021, honored Greek ships that volunteered in the AMVER program.

A total of 17 companies with 22 ships responded to rescue operations, saving a total of 505 people. Due to the pandemic, the guests were limited to 50%, compared to previous years.

For the first time, in 2021 the awards were presented to winners prior to the event to avoid overcrowding on stage and to save time. Their award acceptance was shown in a short video played during the night.

251 companies and 2,081 vessels of Greek interests were honored, which completed at least 128 days at sea.
